

#### NEW PROGRAM FOR MISSIONARY CHILDHOOD MITE BOXES

MCA Mite Box Program (NEW\*\*)

Scripturally inspired by Jesus' parable of the "Widow's Mite" (Luke 2:1-4; Mark 12:41-44), this newly designed Mite Box Program is designed to encourage young people in our Religious Education Programs & Schools. They may be used for sacrificial giving during Advent, Lent, and World Mission Month (October), and in Ordinary Time.

This new Program was prepared and designed through a consultative process led by Missionary Childhood Association (Arch)Diocesan Coordinators across the country.

As for the contents of the MCA Mite Box Program:


- Each Mite Box comes with a bookmark with an MCA prayer, and a small poster where young people meet the children in the Missions helped by their prayers and sacrifices.
- For every 25 Mite Boxes ordered, there is a large poster for classroom use.
- Posters (large and small) and bookmarks are in English and Spanish.

All materials are shipped together and are free no matter how much material is ordered. There is a \$10. shipping fee for any weight.
